- The Mini Expo; and every August in Houston and presented by the Texas Fly Fishers,

BELGIUM CAST – NOT FOR FISHING IN BELGIUM

No more chucking and ducking when casting a weighted streamers or spending more time untangling an indicator rig than fishing. Use a Belgium Cast when casting with weight.

Casting instructors teach the 180-degree rule - a back cast and forward cast along a straight line made in opposite directions of each other. The Belgium cast sweeps the back cast to the side at about 30 degrees off the 180-degree line and then slowly drags the fly around in an elliptical or oval shape until it reaches the 180-degree target line at which time the forward cast is made. This accomplishes two important things needed when casting weight: (1) it avoids the abrupt change of direction when casting with the 180-degree rule and (2) it maintains constant tension on the back cast.

What is the problem? Or why does the 180-degree rule fail when casting weight? First, gravity causes the weight to drop quicker. The caster ducks to keep the fly from hitting the back or back of the head. Second, the momentum of the weight being casted in opposite directions coupled with an abrupt change of direction with a pause between casts results in loss of control of the fly. This loss of control is the big reason why indicator rigs end in tangled mess.

These problems do not exist with a Belgium Cast. The sweep of the back cast at a 30-degree angle keeps the fly away from the caster and dragging the fly around to the 180-degree target line avoid a pause, keeps the fly under constant tension, and avoids an abrupt change of direct.

So how is the Belgium Cast made? It is quite easy. On the back cast sweep the fly back at about 30 degrees off the 180-degree. Right before the line fully unrolls slowly drag the fly in an upward and oval shape until it reaches the 180-degree target line and then make the forward cast. Make this cast slowly, during the oval move circle up and around to the 180-degree line and do not pause on the back cast. Make sure to maintain constant tension during the oval circle up move.

End Note – Other names for the Belgium Cast are the Oval Cast or the Elliptical Cast.

FFI CONSERVATION ACTION LETTERS

Fly Fishers International continues to lead the way in regards to conservation efforts across the country. Fly Fishers International submitted 2 conservation action letters recently to respective agencies. One letter is in support of a restriction on harvest of the Atlantic Striped Bass and the other letter supports a ban on Net Pen Aquaculture in Washington State. This is just one example of the effort that FFI does to help protect our fisheries, and there are plans to do so much more, including supporting local projects in Texas.

Dear Members of the Atlantic Striped Bass Management Board of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission.

As part of its mission to advocate for "all fish, all waters," Fly Fishers International (FFI) encourages you to take decisive policy action at the Board's upcoming special meeting on December 16, 2024 to protect the Atlantic striped bass as well as support the many anglers and businesses that depend on this iconic species for both recreational enjoyment and, in many cases, their livelihoods.

It is FFI's position that, in response to the current conditions of the Atlantic striped bass fishery, the Board must take immediate action to successfully rebuild the stock by 2029 and fulfill its management obligation to this species and your constituents.

We encourage you to be open-minded to any and all measures that ensure not only the long term viability of this fishery but - importantly to our members - its return to a state of abundance. Strong measures are needed now, regardless of how painful they may be in the short term, to avoid the potential and much greater hardships resulting from yet another collapse of this fishery in the not-too-distant future. This is a situation that we all should work hard to avoid.

Be courageous in your approach and take all necessary actions now so that in the future you can look back while enjoying the many benefits of an abundant Atlantic striped bass population, and know the right actions were taken at this critical moment to protect this beloved fish.

Dear Commissioner Franz and Members of the Board of Natural Resources:

We are writing on behalf of Fly Fishers International, a global organization dedicated to the support, enhancement and protection of recreational opportunities and enjoyment of fly fishing. We achieve our mission through teaching all aspects of fly fishing and through our advocacy for conservation of our natural resources. FFI represents the interests of 12,000 fly anglers in the United States and internationally.

We want to express our strong support for Commissioner Franz's proposal to change regulations to prohibit industrial finfish net pen aquaculture in Washington's marine waters.

As the Board of Natural Resources, you have the important job of protecting Washington's public waters and lands for everyone today and for future generations. We urge you to approve this rule that will ensure our public waters will be protected from the dangers associated with this industry, including daily pollution, the spread of harmful viruses and diseases, and catastrophic escape events like the Cypress Island collapse that released 260,000, viral-infected farmed fish into Puget Sound.


Puget Sound and its ecosystems represent a finite resource of great social, cultural, and economic value and we strongly encourage you to protect this irreplaceable public heritage. Given what is at stake, industrial net pen aquaculture is an unacceptable use of public waters that undermines the public's investments in the recovery of wild salmon, orcas, and the greater health of Puget Sound.

We applaud Commissioner Franz's initiative and encourage the Board to finalize this rule.






THE DEENA FLY







Bill tied my dad and me a Deena at an FFI Conclave in Loveland, Colorado years ago and it has been a top producer for me ever since. I brought the fly back to our club in Texas it is on the top fly in everyone's fly box. I have caught three species of trout, large and smallmouth bass, bream, crappie, catfish and even pond stocked tilapia! Bill told me the fly came about as a bit of a mistake, he had an order for some olive wooly buggers and didn't have all the materials he needed so the Deena was developed. The size as well as materials can be varied and still maintain the style and it will still catch fish. The fly can be tied in olive, white/gray, bronze and tan, this is one of my versions:

- Hook TMC5262 (any heavy wire 2X streamer hook will work)
- 2. Tail Marabou (olive, white, gray, tan)
- 3. Body or dubbing to match tail
- 4. Wing Mallard Flank
- 5. Collar (optional) CDC (split thread dubbing technique)

*The Deena can be tied using round lead wraps at the thorax or a bead head to get the fly down in varying currents.
